


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
TOP 10 MOST-STREAMED ARTISTS OF ALL-TIME ON SPOTIFY IN 2024

Rather than Spotify's monthly listeners, we take a look at the top Spotify songs of all time from artists' catalogues, as of April 2024.

Monthly listeners are a great way to see which artists are currently popular on the streaming service, whereas this all-time streams list is a useful way to see the most popular artists in the last decade. We've also compiled more Spotify top tens such as the most-followed artists on Spotify in 2024, the most-streamed female artists by monthly listeners, most-streamed songs of all time, and the most-streamed songs in a single day - who are the common Spotify top artists that reappear across the lists?

There's been movement in the top ten most-streamed artists Spotify list since we last checked in January earlier this year, **Taylor Swift** over taking **Drake** in the top position, thanks to her recent successful albums and global Eras Tour. **Drake** still leads the pack as the most-followed male artist. **BTS** are the most-streamed band.

An artist's all-time streams aren't shared by Spotify with the public so this data comes from



ChartMasters, updated daily. ChartMasters explain their methodology. Their data is "based on streams from tracks available inside their personal page's sections Albums, Singles and Compilations. They are combined together and defined as 'Lead streams'." Appears on streams such as featured tracks are not counted towards lead streams or the ranking, but this number is listed. ChartMasters admit the full list of 1.000 artists may not be 100% accurate, but state the top of their list is thorough.

First up is Taylor Swift, with over <u>77</u> <u>billion streams!</u>

YOUR PODCAST QUEUE IS HERE: THE TOP PODS TO LISTEN TO THIS YEAR

From campy streams of consciousness to scripted histories, here are some must-hear podcasts for the new year.

We're in an era of constant content, and if Spotify's 11 hour "This Is Taylor Swift" playlist isn't enough to fill your work week with an endless stream of noise, then it may be time to climb aboard the podcast wagon. From free-flowing conversations to scripted long-form storytelling, the podcast industry has never been so fertile. So fertile, even, that you may be one of the many paralyzed by decision overload when it comes to starting a new show. Fear not. We've rounded up some of the best podcasts that deserve a stream—none of which are helmed by Tucker Carlson, Ben Shapiro, Jordan Peterson, or other plagues on this great nation. Happy podcasting!

The A24 Podcast

Your annoying film friend's favorite podcast—it's me, I'm your annoying film friend—The A24 Podcast is an irregular pod, perfect for the fickle listener. The show is host free, ad free, and usually coincides with whatever big budget indie film (an oxymoron, we recognize) is being pumped out by the production company. The show pairs such auteurs and figures as Nathan Fielder and Alexa Demie, Sofia Coppola and Celine Song, Patti LuPone and Nathan Lane, Simon Rex and the late Angus Cloud, and more. If you love Variety's "Actors on Actors" or Interview Magazine's irreverent celeb-on-celeb interviews. then you'll love this podcast.

This American Life

A relic of radio show culture, this weekly podcast comes

from WBEZ Chicago Public Radio and is hosted by Ira Glass, one of the erudites' most beloved voices. The show features essays, memoirs, short fiction, and more, with each episode following a theme rooted in modern American culture—think dads, turkey day, words, politics, and more. While the most pretentious among us might call it "easy listening," this is not the show for those looking to giggle through aimless conversation. We have more of that later.

The Broski Report

Oh look, it's later! This new podcast from the internet's favorite comedian Brittany Broski is for the girls, gays, theys, and allies who want to decode great music, horn publicly for high fantasy smut, or have an all-too genuine sob about the plight of womanhood. All of

that and more can be found on The Broski Report, the clips of which you've surely already seen on TikTok.

Call Her Daddy

This ever-relevant podcast is hosted by industry pioneer and recent Cosmo cover girl, Alex Cooper. This comedy podcast debuted in 2018 under Barstool Sports, before moving to Spotify under an industry shaking \$60 million deal for Cooper. In its original form, the show featured comedic commentary on the current state of the sexual marketplace for young women, but has evolved over the years to become one of the internet's leading interview shows, with Cooper leading newsworthy conversations with the likes of Miley Cyrus, Jamie Lynn Spears, Julia Fox, Demi Lovato, and more. Her influence on the culture earned her a new title

from Rolling Stone of "Gen-Z's Barbara Walters," right next to her original moniker, "Daddy."

The Daily

News you can use (to impress at the water cooler), The Daily releases new episodes each morning, with each episode running around 30 minutes and unraveling the most important news story of the day. Don't let the 24 hour loop of terror on cable news fool you, staying informed doesn't require that much work. A Daily episode a day keeps the doom scrolling away.

Hard Fork

Silicon Valley moves faster than you do, so the only way to truly keep up with the happenings of the tech world (aka, the world), is Hard Fork. This podcast is helmed by technology writers at The New York Times, returning to our liberal arts-trained ears each week with the latest news from the control room. Recent episodes have detailed the latest in A.I. technology, the uses of Apple Vision Pro, and legal battles between music record labels and TikTok.

Huberman Lab

The world's number one health podcast, and possibly the only "manosphere" podcast you could realistically discuss with your boyfriend, Huberman Lab is wildly interesting and single handedly responsible for the rise in early morning productivity routines online. The show is led by Dr. Andrew Huberman, a Neuroscience Professor at Stanford University. His show unpacks such issues as the science behind willpower, the actual effect of alcohol on the body, how we can use different sources of light to optimize health, hormones and fertility, and much more. If you snoozed off during all 12 years of pre-collegiate science class, then here is your crash course, with only the information you need.


Infamous

If your group chat is obsessed with juicy gossip and all things celebrity, be an MVP and introduce Infamous to your collective rotation. Co-hosted by veteran Vanity Fair and New York Magazine writer Vanessa Grigoriadis and former

Forbes reporter Natalie Robehmed, this weekly podcast digs all the way in to both high and low pop culture moments and figures, featuring fromthe-vault recordings from famous faces we all know and love (and sometimes hate). Its latest episodes spotlight everything from Meghan Markle's media chess game to the Diddy scandal to the Lohanissance, so yeah, it's a winner.

Las Culturistas

Comedic cultural commentary simply does not get better than Las Culturistas. Seriously, the buck stops with Matt Rogers and Bowen Yang. Together, the comedians and best friends talk about culture and current events in the vein of diva culture, entertainment happenings, and gay pageantry. Each episode follows a loose, conversational structure - sometimes featuring quests, sometimes not—and always culminating in the "I Don't Think So, Honey" segment, during which our hosts and quests have one minute to rail against something in the culture.



Maintenance Phase

Join us, please, on our never-ending journey to unlearn the most toxic and harmful rhetorics spewed by the diet industry from the years of 1990 to 2018, respectively. Hosted by Michael Hobbes and Aubrey Gordon, Maintenance Phase "debunks the junk science behind health and wellness fads," tackling everything from Weight Watchers, to Keto, to BMI, to cleanse culture.

Modern Love

Just in time for love season, this ever-popular podcast from The New York Times explores the love stories of real people-small, big, messy, clean, heartwarming, and heartbreaking. The podcast comes from the Times "Modern Love" column, which has been running for more than 18 years. It's an easy listen, a consistent follow, and a healthy reminder that romance exists somewhere between the dating app algorithms and Hollywood's soapy jaunts.

The Moth

The Moth Podcast is the digitally accessible iteration of The Moth's popular storytelling events, which take place offair, IRL across the country. The Moth events, writers and storytellers take to the stage to tell five-minute stories aligned with the night's given theme. These storytellers are scored and compared, with the best stories moving onto bigger

storytelling events, and eventually landing on The Moth Radio Hour and The Moth Podcast. That was the crash course, but if you want to hear brief, well-written stories from real, not at all famous, people, then try this pod.

The Retrievals

From Serial Productions and The New York Times, this 2023 limited podcast series is a nightmare, but a riveting one at that. The five-part pod explores an investigation into malpractice at the Yale Fertility Center, at which one nurse was swapping fentanyl for saline, sending women into intensive reproductive procedures with no pain relief. Beyond a wild true crime story, the series also discusses female pain and the culture of silence around it, proliferated by a society whose default mode of dealing with women is dismissal.

Slow Burn

This narrative series from Slate recently completed its eighth season, with each season focusing on a major political moment that changed the social fabric of our country forever. These moments include Watergate, the Bill Clinton-Monica Lewinsky scandal, Biggie and Tupac, Roe v. Wade, David Duke and the rise of the KKK. The Road to the Iraq War, and more. The most recent season, which premiered in May of 2023, focused on the Supreme Court confirmation of Clarence Thomas.

Unreal: A Critical History of Reality TV

With each passing year, it seems reality television becomes a larger and larger part of modern American culture—and hey, if we can't beat 'em. ioin 'em. Unreal traces the long and winding history of reality TV, from early competition series like Road Rules. Survivor, and The Challenge, to the sea-change that was the Keeping Up With The Kardashians series premiere, to the relevance of current hits like Love Island. Beneath the fun, the show digs into the ethics of reality television—the good, the bad and the very very ugly.

You Must Remember This

A show dedicated to Hollywood's hidden histories, You Must Remember This was created by American film critic Karina Longworth. The podcast is the perfect blend of everything good—it's funny, it's informative, it's well written and insightful, and it's available on every platform. While the show's typical form stands with Longworth at the podium, it has been known to attract such guests as John Mulaney, Dana Carvey, and Fred Savage. The show runs in dedicated seasons, some of which include "Charles Manson's Hollywood," "Gossip Girls: Hedda Hopper and Louella Parsons," "Dead Blondes," and the latest iteration, "Erotic '90s."

BOOKS THE BEST SUMMER READS 2024


HHRBSSIMMER READS 2024

Funny Story By Emily Henry







A thrilling and unputdownable thriller of stolen identities, romance, and espionage in a small town in Louisana.



The Dead Romantics by Ashley Poston is the perfect escapism and summer beach read.


I've got The Seven Year Slip by Ashely Poston lined up on my Kindle to read over the next couple of weeks and I'm so excited!


Lessons In Chemistry By Bonnie Garmus

No one is more surprised than me by including Fourth Wing by Rebecca Yarros on my summer beach reads in 2024.






Pineapple Street By Jenny Jackson






Wrong Place Wrong Time By Gillian McAllister


Remarkably Bright Creatures is one of those stories that will warm the cockles of your heart and make you fall in love with an octopus. One of my best vacation reads from last year.


Hello Beautiful By Ann Napolitano

Pachinko is a hard novel to forget and its sweeping story is an incredible page-turner.


Good Material By Dolly Alderton


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<u>All About Montana Boyz TikToker Mark Estes</u>

Kristin Cavallari debuted her relationship with Mark Estes in February 2024

Kristin Cavallari has a new man and she's not afraid to show him off.

The Laguna Beach alum revealed her relationship with boyfriend Mark Estes in February 2024 with an Instagram photo of the pair vacationing in Los Cabos, Mexico.

"It was a little early to hard launch someone. 100 percent," Cavallari later admitted on her podcast, *Let's Be Honest*. "However, I feel very different with this man."

Cavallari was previously marrieto Jay Cutler, with whom she shares three children. Camden, Jaxon and Saylor were introduced to Estes ahead of the couple's first date in Nashville.

"I think more than anything, my kids were really excited for me. My kids really wanna see me

happy," Cavallari shared.

So, who is Kristin Cavallari's boyfriend? Here's everything to know about Mark Estes and his relationship with the former reality TV star.

Per his Instagram bio, Estes is based in both Montana and Nashville, where Cavallari currently lives. Previously, the Uncommon James founder said she was "done" with the Nashville dating scene, she told *Entertainment Tonight* in September 2023.

"I've decided I'm done dating in Nashville," she said before adding that she could "guarantee" her next partner would not be a country music star.

"I would consider myself to be a monk at this point," she said. "You can throw anything at me at me, and I'm like, 'OK.' "


However, it seems Cavallari changed her tune after meeting Estes.


He played college football While he was a student at Montana State University and Montana Tech, Estes played for their football teams.

He concluded his college career with the Montana Tech Orediggers in November 2023 after six seasons, including one redshirt season.

"What a ride. Thankful for the last 6 years of what this sport has brought me," he captioned a photo of himself on the field after his final game. "Thanks to all the coaches and brothers I met along the way <3." In addition to his own TikTok account with nearly 120,000 followers, Estes is also part of a TikTok group, Montana Boyz, which has over 700,000 followers. Estes, as well as three of his friends, use the account to post thirst traps and other videos of their cowboy life in Montana.

For Valentine's Day in 2024, they posted a video of themselves "warming up the grill," joking that they were "all single" on the holiday.





Now that Estes' relationship with Cavallari is public, his fellow Montana Boyz are on board, they told PEOPLE in March 2024.

"We love it. [We] support it. It's been fun," Kade Wilcox said, while Kaleb Winterburn added,

"It's been fun meeting her and getting to know her and just everything about that whole world, too. It's cool to see."

Since Estes went public with his relationship with Cavallari, the boys' account has blown up.

"It all kind of happened in the right time, but since that's happened, yeah, it's been a complete shift," Winterburn told PEOPLE. "I think more people are curious about what we're doing — different age ranges, different everybody. It's just from her.... what she's done before. I think it's sweet to see all those other people that are curious about what we're trying to do."

The 'Daddy' Will See You Now.....

The success of Alex Cooper's "Call Her Daddy" podcast has birthed a new media company. Can this millennial solve the riddle of what Gen Z wants?

Is it possible that the next great American media mogul is a woman who would rather sit in bed watching hours of "Grey's Anatomy" than sit courtside at a Los Angeles Lakers game?

Is it possible that she has made crowds of thousands of women scream over her sex tips?

Is it possible that, on her podcast, she has invited rappers to smoke weed and actors to share trauma, but dismissed overtures from the White House?



Alex Cooper is making an argument for all of it.

Ms. Cooper is best known as the host of "Call Her Daddy," a podcast that took off in 2018 as the young woman's answer to Howard Stern. The podcast encountered some well-documented turbulence when Ms. Cooper split with her co-host in 2020, only to land a reported \$60 million three-year deal with Spotify in 2021. As the show aged, it became less bawdy and outrageous, more confessional and sincere.

What is less known is how, over the last year, Ms. Cooper has been building a media company with Matt Kaplan, a film producer and her fiancé.

The company they founded and funded, announced in June as a "Gen Z media venture," is called Trending. It forms an umbrella over Mr. Kaplan's Ace Entertainment — he produced the Netflix teen romance franchise "To All the Boys I've Loved Before," among others — and Ms. Cooper's Unwell network, which currently oversees "Call Her Daddy" and two other podcasts.

Unwell's strategy draws partly on personalities like MrBeast (a stunty YouTuber turned food entrepreneur) and partly from the old Hollywood studio system. Unwell cultivates stars, producing their projects — for now, video podcasts — and helps build brands around them. These brands beget merch and, eventually, consumer products.

The network made its first big move in August, when it announced the signing of the TikTok powerhouse Alix Earle, whose ability to spread trends and sell products has been called the "Alix Earle effect." She has enthralled millions with videos of herself chatting while applying makeup; it isn't difficult to imagine her someday selling makeup, too.

During an interview in early January at Ms. Cooper's West Hollywood studio, where many other press interviews were framed on the walls, something curious was happening with her podcast's rankings. On the Spotify charts, "Call Her Daddy," once the second most popular podcast below "The Joe Rogan Experience," was now at No. 23; "Hot Mess With Alix Earle" had risen to No. 7.

Sitting down with Ms. Cooper, in her plain sweater and jeans and Uggs, this seemed to be the obvious story: At 29, she was becoming the old guard, a wizened millennial usurping herself by elevating these younger stars. (Ms. Earle is 23.)

But this was not the real story. Charts fluctuate, Ms. Cooper explained. There were practical reasons for her lower ranking, including a two-week hiatus from posting new episodes. "Call Her Daddy" not only returned to the Top 10 on the Spotify podcast charts, but in early February, when Spotify relinquished exclusivity of the podcast, it debuted at No. 1 on Apple's podcast charts. Above Mr. Rogan. Above the Kelce brothers. Above "The Daily" and "Dateline."

"I look at Oprah as an example, of her lifting Dr. Phil and other people," Mr. Kaplan, 39, said of Ms. Cooper's relationship to the new shows.


There is some truth in the idea that Ms. Cooper occupies less of the spotlight now. "The goal as I get older is I don't want to just be relying on 'Alex Cooper' and 'Call Her Daddy," she said. "The point of starting this was also so that I have all these different ancillary businesses that can be running."

But the bigger truth is this: She isn't someone to underestimate

"I also know when I need to turn things up," she said.

Hailey herself commented on the gossip, sharing a blunt post to her Instagram Stories.





A few minutes ago, while I was waiting to board my flight, I was talking on the phone with a friend. During our conversation, she asked me where I was. I replied by telling her that the place wasn't very attractive.

When I hung up, the woman who was next to me in line turned to me and commented very rudely: "If you don't like this place, why do you come here?"

Astonished by this morning aggression, I replied: "I don't usually spend time explaining this type of situation, but this time, I want to do you a favor. I'm going to give you a different perspective that might help you see things from another angle and apply it to your life as soon as possible. I can't guarantee results, but it's worth a try." So I told her...

First, I want to make it clear that my preferences about a particular place do not affect your life in any way. I simply, on a personal level, find this place unattractive.


Likewise, I have the inalienable and free right to express my opinion about anything in my life and share it with whomever I choose. What concerns me is that you take my opinion personally to the point of suggesting that I don't come back.

Lady, this is NOT PERSONAL. My perception of beauty or lack thereof does not constitute an attack on anyone, it is not intended to offend, and much less to incite violence. If you were wearing headphones, you probably wouldn't have even heard me and would have gone on with your life as usual. However, your reaction of taking my opinion personally is what changes the course of this situation. And it not only affects your life, but it has implications for all of humanity.

With this, I conclude my speech.

And so, the whole world...

We constantly assume, feel and imagine that everything revolves around us in a personal way.



Imagine how different our existence would be if humans took responsibility for our own internal battles, shortcomings, and shadows. It would be much easier to find our light, our fullness and, above all, our inner peace.

Imagine a world where coexistence is free from violence and judgment, where the beliefs, ideologies, tastes, traditions, actions and choices of each individual are respected.

And how do we come to understand that nothing is personal?

I would like to share my interpretation of various situations that I have experienced in my life. When I managed to understand that these situations were not personal, I was able to free myself and forgive. However, forgiveness was not directed towards others, but towards myself. This understanding goes beyond religion; forgiveness is the noblest act we can perform for our own inner peace.

A long time ago, I came to understand the difference between this ingrained belief and the reality that not everything revolves around us, nor do all our actions have direct repercussions on others.

Let's start with the basics: each individual experiences their own reality, immersed in an abyssal world of their own mind. No one pays as much attention to others as we imagine they do. Nobody!!!!! hahaha

We live with such high standards that it is often difficult to be authentic with ourselves.



Wrongly, we believe that we are not what we believe, or what others believe we are. We define ourselves by our perceptions of what others think of us, understand? That is, we believe that we are what we believe that others believe of us... how hard is that? (Read again)

Living under the scrutiny of others and with such high standards leads us to take everything that happens to us personally and this leads us to useless assumptions.

But why do we take things personally?

This question is crucial, and the basic answer lies in the comfort it offers.

Although it may seem the opposite, it is easier this way.

In a world where we live in society, it is tempting to attribute responsibility to others. However, we come to experience life itself and along the way, making decisions and taking actions involves a great responsibility.

That is why it is easier to blame others when things go wrong; because it exempts us from responsibility.

On the other hand, making the decision to take responsibility requires courage, self-love and, above all, compassion. If we lack any of these elements, it is the first thing we must work on.

People who avoid taking responsibility for their own lives are usually those who have not yet found themselves. Working on self-love and recognizing that we are always where we need to be is essential. Starting by understanding that nothing is inherently good or bad, we are simply experiencing a process in this life to discover our own BEING, or in other words (purpose) which in the end turns out to be simply BEING ALIVE.

These are some variants of taking things personally:

• The internal violence that we generate from a comment or an idea. This is exactly what happened with the lady today; it can be triggered by a comment, an idea, an expectation or a gesture.

The lady today made a comment because she took mine personally. However, there are two assumptions that I considered in order not to take hers personally, not to enter into conflict and not to get caught up in the vicious circle that could have been created.

The first is empathy, which is essential in life. The lady may have had a terrible morning, countless situations that could have happened to her, and perhaps hearing me talk about her city in a way that she did not like was the last straw.

The other possibility is that she might have had a great morning and simply didn't like my comment, which led her to get angry. In either case, the woman took my comment personally and decided to attack me. She could have chosen not to, but she also could have gotten upset and stayed angry. As for me, I appreciated that her comment gave me material to write about because everything in life has two sides; you can choose which one you prefer. Normally, I choose to see things positively, even when they don't seem to be.

Traumas that prevent us from growing (the past)

I consider it of utmost importance to address the following variant. It refers to our past and how we have experienced life, generating "traumas" from the perception of situations we lived through and believed to be personal.

In other words, traumas are ideas that we create by taking things personally.

Everyone, without exception, has lived experiences that have caused us discomfort, some more impactful than others. However, we are not here to judge or measure the level of suffering of each individual.

I can mention several examples, but what has marked my life the most is the abandonment of my son's father, sexual abuse in my childhood, a failed marriage, and other difficult situations that, upon understanding that they were not personal, radically changed my perspective on life in three ways.

Firstly, I began to see my fellow human beings as beings with the same capabilities as me, but without the privilege of initiating a greater process of human consciousness.

Secondly, I understood that nothing that happened to me was personal. Absolutely nothing. We all live our own reality, and how we interpret it depends on our perspective on life. There is no absolute truth or single reality for everyone. We are all going through intense mental and evolutionary processes, each at our own pace and level of consciousness.

Thirdly, I learned to forgive. I do not mean the forgiveness prescribed by religion, as I do not believe in it or its inflexible rules. True forgiveness, outside of any religious norm, context, or consciousness, is an act of compassion towards oneself and humanity. I learned to live my life without stigmas or mental marks.

I decided not to be defined by past events, such as the violated girl, the abandoned mother, or the ex-wife left behind. I chose to be myself, to find my own process, and to forgive to reach my inner peace.

The traumas and wounds we carry are simply labels of what once happened.

They are labels that we decided to take personally and stick them in our minds and lives indefinitely. The label of "abandoned woman" persisted until I decided to tear it off the shirt I was wearing. Was it difficult? Yes, but it hurt more to keep wearing it.

Over time, some labels lost their adhesion and peeled off on their own, while others required therapies and ceremonies until they disappeared completely. I understood that my labels were ideas created from situations that I decided to take personally. I do not deny that they happened, but they are in the past. Today, all that remains of them is an idea that, even if it returns to my mind, I do not latch onto. I no longer see myself as a victim.

What we fail to heal because it keeps happening (present)

The difficulty in healing what continues to happen in the present poses a considerable obstacle to the growth and evolution of the human being and why? One of the most important causes of taking things personally is that, in addition to taking things personally, we live through the beliefs of others.

We love to be accepted and hate to be rejected. For this reason, we begin to seek social acceptance and run the risk of living according to external standards rather than internal ones.


External acceptance is conditioned to something or someone else, but our internal acceptance is quite the opposite; it is free and invaluable, no one can take it away, steal it, or modify it; it only depends on you!

How do you find it? Acceptance does not live off society; it lives off self-love, the care we have for ourselves, and it is cultivated through the practice of self-care and self-esteem. By investing time and energy in getting to know ourselves and valuing our own qualities, we can begin to build a foundation of personal acceptance.

This implies learning to recognize our strengths and limitations without harsh judgment.

Ultimately,

To stop taking things personally implies a change in mentality and emotional habits; finding and nurturing internal acceptance allows us to live more autonomously and consciously, freeing ourselves from the dependence on external validation and allowing us to experience life with a greater sense of freedom and satisfaction.
